# Keynote Speaker



Adam Green, Ph.D.

Adam Green is a long-time collaborator of the Sargent Shriver Peace Institute. He appeared in the documentary about Sargent Shriver, American Idealist: The Story of Sargent Shriver, and contributed to the planning and proposal of the Sargent Shriver Fellows Program at the University of Chicago Institute of Politics. Adam is currently leading the efforts to edit and annotate the forthcoming memoir by Sargent Shriver, We Called It a War. The memoir outlines Sargent Shriver's efforts to lead the War on Poverty.

Adam's academic home is the University of Chicago, where he is Associate Professor in the departments of History and of Race, Diaspora, and Indigeneity. His field specialties include modern US history; African American history; urban history; comparative racial politics; and cultural economy. He is also a Faculty Affiliate at the Center for the Study of Race, Politics,

and Culture; a Faculty Board Member at the Karla Scherer Center for the Study of American Culture; and a Senior Fellow at the Society of Fellows in the Liberal Arts at the College.

Adam is the author of Selling the Race: Culture, Community and Black Chicago, 1940-1955 and coeditor of Time Longer Than Rope: A Century of African American Activism. He has lectured on campuses and at community venues, appeared in multiple film documentaries, and on WTTW (PBS) Chicago, WBEZ Chicago (radio), Al-Jazeera, BBC (radio) and C-SPAN. He has been involved in community-based initiatives in New York, Chicago, and Los Angeles related to police accountability and educational justice.

Adam is also currently involved in a Columbia University project to create the official oral history of the Obama presidency.

# History of Community Action Agencies

In his State of the Union address to Congress on January 8, 1964, President Lyndon B. Johnson declared "an unconditional" 'War on Poverty' in America. In August of that year, the Economic Opportunity Act of 1964 (EOA) was passed, creating a Federal Office of Economic Opportunity (OEO). The OEO created Community Action Agencies (CAAs) to empower individuals and families living in poverty.

CAASTLC, Inc. was originally incorporated as Human Development Corporation of Metropolitan St. Louis (HDC) in 1968. In 2003, Community Action Agency of St. Louis County, Inc. became part of a national rebranding effort to make CAAs more identifiable in their communities.

CAASTLC provides services to more than 40,000 customers per year in St. Louis County. There are currently over 1,000 CAAs nationwide, engaged in a broad range of activities including energy assistance, home weatherization, job training, and leadership classes.

# Emcee Carol A. Daniel



Carol A. Daniel is first and foremost, a mother and wife. She and her husband Patrick are celebrating 27 years of marriage. They are also the proud parents of two sons, 25-year-old Patrick Henry Daniel Jr., a software developer and 21-year-old Marcus Isiah Daniel, an actor and poet who is currently training to be a chef.

Carol began her career at the "Voice of St. Louis" in 1995 as an anchor, reporter and talk show host. The program director was driving to Memphis with his family, heard Carol on the air at a radio station in Cape Girardeau, Missouri and called her to invite her to apply for a job at the legendary station. She got the job and moved to St. Louis two weeks later to begin her career at KMOX. The 38-year media veteran was once a campaign organizer, a recruiter for the U.S. Census Bureau, and even worked as a substitute teacher!

Carol is a gifted motivational speaker who believes in the biblical verse, "To whom much is given, much is required." The St. Louis Media History Foundation inducted her into the Media Hall of Fame in 2022. In 2021, the Greater St. Louis Association of Black Journalist named her a "Living Legend" and in 2019, the St. Louis Press Club selected her as a Media Person of the year. The National Newspaper Association has honored Carol twice for her column in the St. Louis American Newspaper for humor. Her other honors have come from the Missouri Broadcaster's Association, the YWCA Women's Leader Class, STL TV, and Delux Magazine of St. Louis selected her to their Power 100.

Carol served three terms as President of the Greater St. Louis Association of Black Journalists. She is a member of New Life in Christ Interdenominational Church in O'Fallon, Illinois where she and her husband spearheaded the couple's ministry, "Journey to Oneness" for nearly a decade.



# The Bosman Twins

Florida A&M University music scholars, Dwayne Bosman and Dwight Bosman are composers, arrangers, jazz artists and music educators.

Born in St. Louis, Missouri, Dwayne's and Dwight's passion for jazz started at an early age. They grew up listening to the sounds of great jazz artists such as Earl "Fatha" Hines, Count Basie, Duke Ellington and their father Lloyd Smith, who was a well-known businessman and a side man in Basie's and Ellington's orchestras. Paula V. Smith, the twins' mother and the first African American Administrator of the Wage and Hour Division




In April of 2015, the "Legendary" Bosman Twins released an album of original music, entitled "When Lions Roar" and from the album "Many Moons," a cinematic jazz video was released. During their

inaugural CD release weekend, The Bosman Twins sold out all four shows at The Ferring Jazz Bistro, inside the Harold and Dorothy Steward Center for Jazz in addition to jazz houses across the country.

The Bosman Twins are extremely proud and grateful for awards and recognitions received and opportunities provided to share their music with the rest of the world. On September 12, 2021, The Bosman Twins were honored for their work and contribution to the St. Louis music scene when they received the "Legends Award" from The Kranzberg Foundation during

the inaugural Music at The Intersection Heritage Festival. In January 2016. The Bosman Twins received the prestigious Excellence in the Arts from the St. Louis Arts and Education Council, and in November of 2015, they were inducted into the St. Louis Jazz Hall of Fame and received the George Smith Diversity Award from the Musicians' Association of St. Louis Local 2-187. In May of 2010, The Bosman Twins traveled to Stuggart, Germany with City of St. Louis Mayor, Francis Slay and delegation, where they opened The American Days Festival at the U.S. Consulate General performing for DPO Doria Rosen and other illustrious guests.

These distinguished gentlemen of jazz are composers, arrangers, recording and performing artists who share in the legacy and tradition of great jazz through education, creativity and innovation. The Bosman Twins are true ambassadors of music.

# Honorary Co-Chairs

Gail and Michael grew up in St Louis. Gail graduated from Southern Illinois University at Edwardsville and Michael graduated from Washington University. Shortly after Gail's graduation, they moved to Houston, Texas and began their careers. Over the next 15 years, they moved seven times and lived in six different states as they climbed the corporate ladder. Gail worked in Sales and Marketing while Michael worked in Human Resources.

In 1996 they returned to St Louis when Michael became a Partner and Chief Human

Resources Officer with Edward Jones, and Gail resumed her modeling career while they raised their children.

In 2005, Michael joined Express Scripts as Senior Vice President and Chief Human Resources Officer and over the next five years ascended to the position of Executive Vice President with responsibility for all the domestic subsidiaries, firm strategy, research, and clinical services and most of the corporate staff groups.

In 2009 Gail and Michael chaired the Charmaine Chapman Society and raised more than \$1.7 million for the United Way of Greater St Louis. The Charmaine

Chapman Society is the largest and most successful African American giving group within the United States.

In 2010, Michael led the spin-off of Rx Outreach from Express Scripts and converted the organization into a non-profit entity, enabling underserved communities the ability to access affordable medication. Gail poured herself into the mission and volunteered to improve community outreach and fundraising. To date Rx Outreach has saved patients over \$800 million and helped improve

the quality of life for approximately half a million people.

Gail has written and published a children's book "Is My Little Boy Blue?" in hopes of encouraging conversations and destigmatizing mental health.

Michael and Gail continue to volunteer in the community, serving at One Family Church and individually on non-profit organizations such as BJC Healthcare, Rx Outreach, and The Fam which this past year has helped over 40 African American families purchase their first home.

They enjoy traveling and spending time with their children and four granddaughters.

# Journey Award

Dr. Daniel Isom was appointed Interim Director of Public Safety for the City of St. Louis by Mayor Tishaura Jones on April 20, 2021. He is currently on leave as the executive director of the Regional Justice Information Service (REJIS).

Isom joined the Metropolitan St. Louis Police Department in 1988 and was appointed Chief of Police in 2008. He was the city's 33rd Chief of Police, and the 3rd African American to serve in this role. He retired in 2013 after 24 years of service.

Dr. Isom is an adjunct professor at the University of Missouri-St. Louis Department of Criminology and Criminal Justice and an adjunct professor at the Washington University-St. Louis Brown School of Social Work. Isom served as the Public Safety Director for Missouri during the Ferguson Crisis and co-chaired the working group on Citizen-Law Enforcement Relations as a member of the Ferguson Commission.

Isom received a Bachelor's, Master's and Ph.D. in Criminology and Criminal Justice, all from the University of Missouri-St. Louis. He holds a Master's in Public Administration from St. Louis University, is a graduate of the FBI National Academy, FBI National Executive Institute, and the Police Executive Forum Senior Management Institute.

Isom has a variety of interests related to the management of police operations. The structural design of police departments from a political and community perspective, operational strategies for crime control, police officers' individual behavioral issues, professional cultural perspectives' influence on community-police relations, and police management are professional and research emphasis of Dr. Isom.

Eisenhower Fellowships selected him as an U.S.A. Eisenhower Fellow in 2013 to study police education and training in Europe. Dr. Isom was also a Fellow at the University of Chicago Institute of Politics in 2016.






