HOUSING & ENERGY

WEATHERIZATION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (WAP)

CAASTLC's Weatherization Assistance Program is designed to reduce air infiltration into homes to help households save money on their heating and cooling bills and improve comfort while ensuring health and safety. Households save an average of \$437 per year after weatherization.

HOUSING ASSISTANCE

CAASTLC offers comprehensive housing assistance including Down Payment Assistance, Housing Counseling, Disaster Relief, and Rent/Mortgage Assistance (depending on funding availability).

ENERGY SERVICES

CAASTLC's Energy Services programs include Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP), Dollar Help, Dollar More and Heat Up St. Louis, which are designed to stop energy service disconnection and restore services to a home. After receiving a one-time Energy Assistance (EA) pledge, a disconnection notice is required for any additional assistance.

H2O ASSISTANCE

In partnership with Missouri American Water, CAASTLC's H2O Assistance program aids families by stopping water service disconnection and restore services to a home. No disconnection notice is required.

FAMILY & ECONOMIC SECURITY

Case Management is a customer-centered, goal-oriented process for assessing the needs of an individual/family and guiding them to achieve their goals and economic security by bundling services, including education and employment.

DRUG & ALCOHOL EDUCATION CLASSES

These classes, facilitated by certified alcohol and drug counselors, utilize informative materials and group discussions to help prevent substance abuse.

ANGER MANAGEMENT EDUCATION CLASSES

Using cognitive behavioral theories for learning, these classes emphasize hope by providing methods to identify and manage anger.

EMPLOYMENT DEVELOPMENT

This intensive workforce curriculum teaches resume building, job search techniques, computer skills, and other tools necessary to obtain and retain employment.

LIFE SKILLS CLASSES

CAASTLC's Life Skills classes help customers stabilize their household through education and training in Health & Wellness, Financial Management, Parenting & Family Development, Home Management and Energy Conservation.

SKILL UP SkillUP is a free program where SNAP (Food Stamp) recipients receive help with skills, training, employer connections and getting a get a job (or a better job). Case Managers help customers create individual plans to reach goals and start a new career once training is complete.

REENTRY SUPPORT FOR RETURNING CITIZENS

Reentry Support is designed to help justice-involved individuals find satisfying work by giving useful tips to navigate the job market, developing resumes that incorporate prison education and work programs, providing tools to improve interviewing techniques; and offering entrepreneurial training for those desiring to start a business. All customers are assigned a case manager to assist with identifying needs and setting achievable goals. The Makin' It Work curriculum is a core component of this goals. HEALTH & NUTRITION

DRIVE-THROUGH FOOD PANTRY – BY APPOINTMENT

In collaboration with St. Louis Area Food Bank and others, CAASTLC provides USDA commodities and nutritious food items to individuals and families needing help. Our application process and food distribution are contact free.

CAASTLC's SEEDS OF HOPE FARM

Through our farm in Spanish Lake, CAASTLC nurtures a healthy food culture in an area considered a food desert. Fresh, organically grown food is distributed to low-income families through CAASTLC's food pantry and community partner food pantries. Volunteer opportunities are available for individuals and groups. Interactive dinners and free classes on cooking, container gardening, starting your own garden, and growing herbs are offered for the whole family. Healthy lifestyles begin with healthy eating.

YOUTH SERVICES

YOUTH CASE MANAGEMENT

CAASTLC offers Case Management services that assist youth in identifying interests, goals, skills, and abilities to help them succeed in their educational endeavors and their career path structure.

HISET (GED)

In partnership with St. Louis County school districts, CAASTLC provides Case Management and supportive services to those enrolled in HiSET or technical education programs to help individuals attain educational certification.

REALITY ENRICHMENT AND LIFE LESSONS (REALL)

This hands-on simulation focuses on keeping youth in school and challenges them to think critically about how choices and decisions made in adolescence lead to rewards and consequences in adulthood. Middle and high schools as well as youth groups can request to participate in this impactful exercise.

CAASTLC SEEDS OF HOPE FARM - STEM CURRICULUM

Featuring a curriculum with lessons developed by UMSL College of Education, Seed St. Louis, Edible Schoolyard, and others, students and youth groups participate in hands-on agricultural experiences based on the science of farming.

COMMUNITY OUTREACH

POVERTY SIMULATIONS

Missouri's Community Action Poverty Simulation (CAPS) is a unique workshop exercise that helps people better understand what life is like with a shortage of money and an abundance of stress.

JOB FAIRS & HIRING EVENTS

CAASTLC hosts two annual job fairs and numerous hiring events within the St. Louis County region. A variety of employers participate and often provide on-site employment opportunities.

STEP UP TO LEADERSHIP

Step Up to Leadership is a workshop designed for incomeeligible, community-minded individuals who desire to develop leadership skills and turn their civic passions into community action, including board opportunities. Topics cover the value of grassroots participation, goal setting, public speaking, meeting facilitation, negotiation, conflict resolution, and grant writing.

IMMIGRANT INCLUSION

This program is designed to help immigrants build their lives in the USA by providing a network of resources and life skills classes that will help in understanding the social and cultural environment. We provide support from the first steps of meeting basic needs such as food, finding affordable housing, and navigating the legal processes, to achieving educational and career goals.
